HEALTH CARE REFORM BILL GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

NON-STATE

Title I – Quality, Affordable Health Care for All Americans

Sec. 1322 Federal Program to Assist Establishment and Operation of Nonprofit, Member-Run health Insurance Issuers

– This program will be known as the Consumer Operated and Oriented Plan (Co-Op) program. There are appropriations of \$6,000,000,000 to carry out this section.

Sec. 3021 Health Information Technology Enrollment Standards and Protocols – Grants for Implementation of appropriate enrollment HIT – Awards to develop new, and adapt existing, technology systems to implement the HIT enrollment standards and protocols. No authorization of appropriation listed.

Title II – Role of Public Programs

Sec. 2701 - Sec. 1139B Adult Health Quality Measures – These grants are for the development, testing, and validation of emerging and innovative evidence-based measures. There are appropriations for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2014, \$60,000,000 for the purpose of carrying out this section.

Sec. 2951- Sec. 511 Maternal, Infant, And Early Childhood Home Visiting Programs – Grants for Early Childhood Home Visitation Programs – Grants to deliver services under early childhood home visitation programs. There are appropriations for years 2010 through 2014, totaling \$1,150,000,000.

Sec. 2952 - Sec. 512 Services to Individuals with a Postpartum Condition and their Families – Grants for projects that deliver essential services to individuals with or at risk for postpartum conditions and their families. There are appropriations for \$3,000,000 for 2010 and sums as may be necessary for 2011 and 2012.

Sec. 2953 - Sec. 513 Personal Responsibility Education – Grants to Implement Innovative strategies – Grants to implement innovative youth pregnancy prevention strategies and target services to high-risk, vulnerable, and culturally under-represented youth population. **Grants for Indian Tribes or Tribal Organizations** – Grants to Indian tribes and tribal organizations to implement innovative youth pregnancy prevention strategies. There are appropriations for \$75,000,000 for years 2010 through 2014.

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Title III – Improving the Quality and Efficiency of Health Care

Sec. 3015 - Sec. 399II Collection and Analysis of Data for Quality and Resource Measures – Grants for the collection and aggregation of consistent data on quality and resource use measures to support health care delivery to implement the public reporting of performance information. **Consistent Data Aggregation** – Grants may be awarded only to entities that enable summary data that can be integrated and compared across multiple sources. There are appropriated sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 3501 - Sec. 934 – Quality Improvement Technical Assistance and Implementation – Grants to provide technical support to institutions that deliver health care and health care providers so that such institutions and providers understand, adapt, and implement the models and practices identified in the research conducted by the Center, including the Quality Improvement Networks Research Program. There are appropriations for \$20,000,000 for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 3504 – Design and implementation of regionalized systems for emergency care - Sec. 1204 – Competitive Grants for Regionalized Systems for Emergency Care Response – Grants to support pilot projects that design, implement, and evaluate innovative models of emergency care and trauma systems. There are authorized to be appropriated \$24,000,000 for each fiscal year 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 3013 - Sec. 931 Quality Measure Development – Grants for purposes of developing, improving, updating, or expanding quality measures. There is \$75,000,000 appropriated per year for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 3502 Establishing Community Health Teams to Support the Patient-Centered Medical Home – Grants to eligible entities to establish community-based interdisciplinary, interprofessional teams to support primary care practices, including obstetrics and gynecology practices. No specific amounts authorized or appropriated.

Sec. 3503 – Sec. 935 Medication Management Services in Treatment of Chronic Disease – Grants to implement medication management services provided by licensed pharmacists, as a collaborative, multidisciplinary, inter-professional approach to the treatment of chronic diseases. **Grants or Contracts to Fund Development of Performance Measures** – Grants for the purpose of funding the development of performance measures that assess the use of medication therapy management services. No specific amounts authorized or appropriated.

Sec. 3505 Trauma Care Centers and Service Availability – Grants to qualified public, nonprofit Indian Health Service, Indian tribal, and urban Indian trauma centers to assist in defraying substantial uncompensated care costs, to further the core missions of such trauma center, and to provide emergency relief to ensure the continued and future availability of trauma services. There are appropriations of \$100,000,000 for 2009, and sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2015.

Sec. 3506-Sec. 936 Program to Facilitate Shared Decision-Making – Grants to develop, update, and produce patient decision aids for preference sensitive care to assist health care providers in educating patients, caregivers, and authorized representatives concerning treatment and care. Grants to assist in implementation of such aids, for the establishment and support of Shared Decision making Resource Centers. There are appropriations of such sums as may be necessary for 2010 and each subsequent year.

Sec. 3508 Demonstration Program to Integrate Quality Improvement and Patient Safety Training Into Clinical Education of Health Professionals – Grants to carry out demonstration projects to develop and implement academic

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curricula that integrates quality improvement and patient safety in the clinical education of health professional. Awards will be made on a competitive basis and pursuant to peer review. No specific amounts authorized or appropriated.

Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health

Sec. 4101 – School-Based Health Centers (Under Subtitle B – Increasing Access to Clinical Preventative Services) –

Grants for the establishment and to support the operation of School-Based Health Centers. There are appropriations of \$50,000,000 for 2010 through 2013.

Sec. 4102 Oral Healthcare Prevention Activities – Section 399LL-1 – Research-Based Dental Caries Disease

Management – Grants to demonstrate the effectiveness of research-based dental caries disease management activities. There are appropriations of such sums as necessary.

Sec. 4201 Community Transformation Grants – Competitive grants for the implementation, evaluation, and dissemination of community preventive health activities to reduce chronic disease rates, prevent the development of secondary conditions, address health disparities, and develop a stronger evidence-base of effective prevention programming. There are appropriations of such sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 4202 Healthy Aging, Living Well; Evaluation of Community Based Prevention and Wellness Programs for Medicare Beneficiaries – Grants to carry out 5-year pilot programs to provide public health community interventions, screenings, and where necessary, clinical referrals for individuals who are between 55 and 64 years of age. There are appropriations of such sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 4305 Advancing Research and Treatment for Pain Care Management – Sec. 759 Program for Education and Training in Pain Care – Grants to health professions schools, hospices, and other public and private entities for the development and implementation of programs to provide education and training to health care professionals in pain care. There are appropriations of sums as may be necessary for 2010 and 2011.

Title V – Health Care Workforce

Sec. 5206 Grants for State and local programs – Grants to award scholarships to enroll in degree or professional training programs to enable mid-career professionals in the public health and allied health workforce to receive additional training in the field of public health or allied health. There is \$60,000 appropriated for 2010 and such sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2015.

Sec. 5208 Nurse-Managed Health Clinics – Funding for the development and operation of nurse-managed health clinics that provide primary care of wellness services to underserved populations and that is associated with a school, college, university or department of nursing, federally qualified health center, or independent nonprofit health or social services agency. There are appropriations of \$50,000,000 for 2010 and sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2014.

Sec. 5301 Training in Family Medicine, General Internal Medicine, General Pediatrics, and Physician Assistantship – Sec. 747 Primary Care Training and Enhancement - Grants to an accredited public or nonprofit private hospital, school of medicine or osteopathic medicine, academically affiliated physician assistant training program, or a public or private nonprofit entity for training in Family Medicine, General Internal Medicine, General Pediatrics, and Physician Assistant training programs. There is \$125,000,000 for 2010 and sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2014.

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Sec. 5302 – Sec. 747A Training Opportunities for Direct Care Workers – Grants to provide new training opportunities for direct care workers who are employed in long-term care settings for individuals with mental retardation. There are appropriations of \$10,000,000 for 2011 through 2013.

Sec. 5303 – Sec. 748 – Training in General, Pediatric, and Public Health Dentistry - Grants to a school of dentistry, public or nonprofit private hospital, or a public or private nonprofit entity to plan, develop, and operate, or participate in, an approved professional training program in the field of general dentistry, pediatric dentistry, or public health dentistry. There are appropriations of \$30,000,000 for 2010 and sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2015.

Sec. 5303 - Sec. 752 Continuing Educational Support for Health Professionals Serving in Underserved Communities – Grants to improve health care, increase retention, increase representation of minority faculty members, enhance the practice environment, and provide information dissemination and educational support to reduce professional isolation. There are appropriations of \$5,000,000 per year for 2010 through 2014 and sums as may be necessary for each subsequent year.

Sec. 5304 – Sec. 340G-1 Alternative Dental Health Care Providers Demonstration Project – Grants to 15 eligible entities to establish a demonstration program to establish training programs to train, or to employ, alternative dental health care providers in order increase access to dental health care services in rural and other underserved communities. There are appropriations for sums as may be necessary to carry out this section.

Sec. 5305 – Geriatric Education and Training; Career Awards; Comprehensive Geriatric Education – Grants to entities that operate geriatric education centers. Geriatric Career Incentive Awards – Grants to individuals who foster greater interest among a variety of health professionals in entering the field of geriatrics, long-term care, and chronic care management. There are appropriations of \$10,800,000 for 2011 through 2014 for education centers and \$10,000,000 for 2011 through 2013 for the career incentive grants.

Sec. 5306 Mental and Behavioral Health Education and Training Grants - Grants to eligible institutions of higher education for the development and implementation of interdisciplinary training of psychology graduate students for providing behavioral and mental health services, including substance abuse prevention and treatment services. There are appropriations for 2010 through 2013 - \$8,000,000 for training in social work; \$12,000,000 for training in graduate psychology, of which not less than \$10,000,000 shall be allocated for doctoral, postdoctoral, and internship level training; \$10,000,000 for training in professional child and adolescent mental health; and \$5,000,000 for training in paraprofessional child and adolescent work.

Sec. 5307 Cultural Competency, Prevention, and Public Health and Individuals with Disabilities Grants – Grants for the development, evaluation, and dissemination of research, demonstration projects, and model curricula for cultural competency, prevention, public health proficiency, reducing health disparities, and aptitude for working with individuals with disability training for use in health professions schools and continuing education programs. There are appropriations of sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2015.

Sec. 5308 Advanced Nursing Education Grants – Grants for authorized nurse-midwifery programs that have as their objective the education of midwives; and are accredited by the American College of Nurse-Midwives Accreditation Commission for Midwifery education. No specific appropriation amount.

Sec. 5309 Nurse Education, Practice, and Retention Grants – Grants to enhance the nursing workforce by initiating and maintaining nurse retention programs. There are appropriations of sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2012.

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Sec. 5313 – Sec. 399V Grants to Promote Positive Health Behaviors and Outcomes –Grants to eligible entities to promote positive health behaviors and outcomes for populations in medically underserved communities through the use of community health workers. There are appropriations of sums as may be necessary for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 5315 - Sec. 271 United States Public Health Sciences Track – Grants to any nonprofit entity for the purpose of carrying out cooperative enterprises in medical, dental, physician assistant, pharmacy, behavioral and mental health, public health, and nursing research, consultation, and education. There are appropriations beginning in 2010 of sums as may be necessary.

Sec. 5316 Demonstration Grants for Family Nurse Practitioner Training Programs – 3 year grants to eligible entities for the purpose of operating the nurse practitioner primary care programs. Grants for technical assistance to 1 or more FQHCs or NMHCs that have demonstrated expertise in establishing a nurse practitioner residency training program. Each grant will not exceed \$600,000 per year, and there are appropriations for sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2014.

Sec. 5403 Interdisciplinary, Community-based Linkages. Area Health Education Centers - Awards to initiate health care workforce educational programs or to continue to carry out comparable programs that are operating an area health education center program. There are appropriations of \$125,000,000 for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 5404 Workforce Diversity Grants – Stipends for diploma or associate degree nurses to enter a bridge or degree completion program, student scholarships or stipends for accelerated nursing degree programs, pre-entry preparation, advanced education preparation, and retention activities. No authorization for appropriation listed.

Sec. 5507 – Sec. 2008 Demonstration Projects to Address Health Professions Workforce Needs – Grants to conduct demonstration projects that are designed to provide the opportunity to obtain education and training for occupations in the health care field that pay well and are expected to either experience labor shortages or be in high demand. Assurance of Opportunities for Indian Populations – At least 3 grants will be reserved for an entity that is an Indian tribe, tribal organization, or Tribal College or University. There are appropriations of \$85,000,000 per year for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 5507- Sec. 2009 Program for Early Detection of Certain Medical Conditions Related to Environmental Health Hazards – Grants for screening at-risk individuals for environmental health conditions and developing and disseminating public information and education. There are appropriations of \$23,000,000 2010 through 2014; and \$20,000,000 for each 5-fiscal year period thereafter.

Sec. 5508 – Sec. 749A Increasing Teaching Capacity – Teaching Health Center Development Grants – Grants to teaching health centers for the purpose of establishing new accredited or expanded primary care residency programs. There are appropriations of \$25,000,000 for 2010, \$50,000,000 for 2011, \$50,000,000 for 2012, and sums as may be necessary for each year thereafter. Not to exceed \$5,000,000 annually may be used for technical assistance program grants.

Sec. 5507 – Sec. 5601 Spending for Federally Qualified Health Centers – Grants for FQHCs. There are appropriations as follows: 2010, \$2,988,821,592; 2011, \$3,862,107,440; 2012, \$4,990,553,440; 2013, \$6,448,713,307; 2014, \$7,332,924,155; 2015, \$8,332,924,155; 2016, and each subsequent fiscal year, the amount appropriated for the preceding fiscal year adjusted by the product of—(i) one plus the average percentage increase in costs incurred per patient served; and (ii) one plus the average percentage increase in the total number of patients served.

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Sec. 5604 –Sec. 520K Co-Locating Primary and Specialty Care in Community-Based mental Health Settings – Grants to establish demonstration projects for the provision of coordinated and integrated services to special populations in community-based mental and behavioral health settings. There are appropriations of \$50,000,000 for 2010 and sums as may be necessary for years 2011 through 2014.

Sec. 5606 State Grants to Health Care Providers Who Provide Services to a High Percentage of Medically Underserved Populations or other Special Populations – Grants to health care providers who treat a high percentage of medically underserved populations or other special populations. There are appropriations of \$4,000,000 per year for 2010 through 2013.

Sec. 749B Rural Physician Training Grants – Grant program for assisting eligible entities in recruiting students most likely to practice medicine in underserved rural communities, providing rural-focused training and experience, and increasing the number of recent allopathic and osteopathic medical school graduates who practice in underserved rural communities. There are appropriations of \$4,000,000 per year for 2010 through 2013.

Sec. 768 Preventive Medicine and Public Health Training Program Grant – Grants to provide training to graduate medical residents in preventive medicine specialties. There are appropriations of \$43,000,000 for 2010, and sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2015.

Title VI – Transparency and Program Integrity

Sec. 2031 Establishment and Support of Elder Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation Forensic Centers – Grants to establish and operate stationary and mobile forensics centers, to develop forensic expertise regarding, and provide services relating to, elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation. There are appropriations as follows: 2011, \$4,000,000; 2012, \$6,000,000; and for years 2013 and 2014, \$8,000,000 per year.

Sec. 2041 Enhancement of Long-Term Care – Grants for individuals to train for, seek, and maintain employment providing direct care in long-term care. Grants to long-term care facilities to assist in offsetting the cost of purchasing, leasing, developing, and implementing certified EHR technology. There are appropriations as follows: 2011, \$20,000,000; 2012, \$17,500,000; and 2013 and 2014, \$15,000,000 per year.

Sec. 6114 National Demonstration Projects on Culture Change and Use of Information Technology in Nursing Homes – Under each demonstration project conducted under this section, 1 or more grants will be awarded to facility-based settings for the development of best practices. There are appropriations for sums as may be necessary.

Title X - Strengthening Quality, Affordable Health Care for All Americans

Sec. 10305 Data Collection; Public Reporting – Grants for collecting and aggregating consistent data on quality and resource use measures from information systems used to support health care delivery. No authorization of appropriation listed.

Sec. 10334 Minority Health – Grants to assure improved health status of racial and ethnic minorities and to develop measures to evaluate the effectiveness of activities aimed at reducing health disparities and supporting the local community. There are appropriations for sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2016.

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Sec. 10408 Grants for Small Businesses to Provide Comprehensive Workplace Wellness Programs - These grants are eligible to employers to provide their employees with access to comprehensive workplace wellness programs. There are appropriations of \$200,000,000 for 2011 through 2015.

Sec. 340H Community-Based Collaborative Care Network Program – Grants to support community-based collaborative care networks. There are appropriations for sums as may be necessary for 2011 through 2015.

Sec. 10413 - Sec. 399NN Young Women’s Breast Health Awareness and Support of Young Women Diagnosed with Breast Cancer – Grants to organizations and institutions to provide health information from credible sources and substantive assistance directed to young women diagnosed with breast cancer and pre-neoplastic breast diseases. There are appropriations of \$9,000,000 per year for 2010 through 2014.

Sec. 10409 - Sec. 402C Cures Acceleration Network – Grants to accelerate the development of high need cures, including through the development of medical products and behavioral therapies and for innovations to promote innovation in technologies supporting the advanced research and development and production of high need cures. There are appropriations of \$500,000,000 for 2010 and sums as may be necessary for subsequent years.

Sec. 10410 – Sec. 520B Grants to establish national centers of excellence for depression, which will engage in activities related to the treatment of depressive disorders. There are appropriations of \$100,000,000 per year for 2011 through 2015; and \$150,000,000 per year for 2016 through 2020.

State

Title I – Quality, Affordable Health for All Americans - Subtitle D — Sec. 1311 Affordable Choices Health Benefit Plans – Grants, awarded, not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of the Act, to States, to use for activities (including planning activities) related to establishing an American Health Benefit Exchange. For each fiscal year, the Secretary shall determine the total amount that the Secretary will make available to each State for grants under this subsection

Title I – Quality, Affordable Health Care for All Americans - Part A Sec. 2793 Health Insurance Consumer Information – Grants to States to enable such States (or the Exchanges operating in such States) to establish, expand or provide support for office of health insurance consumer assistance; or health insurance ombudsman programs. There is appropriated \$30,000,000 for the first fiscal year, and for subsequent fiscal years, for which this section applies to carry out this section.

Title II – Role of Public Programs - Subtitle I – Improving the Quality of Medicaid for Patients and Providers - Sec. 2703 State Option to Provide Health Homes for Enrollees with Chronic Conditions – A planning grant may be awarded to States for purposes of developing a state plan amendment under this section.

No authorization for appropriation listed.

Title III – Improving the Quality and Efficiency of Health Care - Subtitle F – Health Care Quality Improvements – Sec. 3505 – Trauma Care Centers and Service Availability - Part H – Trauma Service Availability – Sec. 1281 Grants to States – Grants to promote universal access to trauma care services provided by trauma centers and trauma-related physician specialties.

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For the purpose of carrying out this part, there is authorized to be appropriated \$100,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2015. If the amount of appropriations for this part in a fiscal year is \$30,000,000 or more, the Secretary shall divide such funding evenly among all states.

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Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health – Subtitle A – Modernizing Disease Prevention and Public Health Systems - Sec. 4004 Education and Outreach Campaign Regarding Preventative Benefits – Grants to States and other entities for education and outreach campaigns regarding preventative benefits including the creation of a website and personalized prevention plans.

There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary to carry out this section.

Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health – Subtitle B – Increasing Access to Clinical Preventive Services -Sec. 4108 Incentives for Prevention of Chronic Diseases in Medicaid – Grants to States to carry out Initiatives to provide incentives to Medicaid beneficiaries who successfully participate in programs with the purpose of testing approaches that may encourage behavior modification and determine scalable solutions.

Out of any funds in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, there are appropriated for the 5-year period beginning on January 1, 2011, \$100,000,000 to the Secretary to carry out this section. Amounts shall remain available until expended.

Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health – Subtitle C – Creating Healthier Communities - Sec. 4201 Community Transformation Grants – Competitive grants for State and local governmental agencies and community-based organizations for the implementation, evaluation, and dissemination of evidence-based community preventive health activities in order to reduce chronic disease rates, prevent the development of secondary conditions, address health disparities, and develop a stronger evidence-base of effective prevention programming.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section, such sums as may be necessary for each fiscal year 2010 through 2014.

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Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health – Subtitle C – Creating Healthier Communities - Sec. 4202 Healthy Aging, Living Well; Evaluation of Community Based Prevention and Wellness Programs for Medicare Beneficiaries – Grants to State or local health departments and Indian tribes to carry out 5-year pilot programs to provide public health community interventions, screenings, and where necessary, clinical referrals for individuals who are between 55 and 64 years of age.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this subsection, such sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2014.

Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health – Subtitle C – Creating Healthier Communities - Sec. 4204 Immunizations – Grants to States to improve the provision of recommended immunizations for children, adolescents, and adults through the use of evidence-based interventions for high-risk populations through the establishment of a demonstration program.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this subsection, such sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2014.

Title IV – Prevention of Chronic Disease and Improving Public Health – Subtitle D – Support for Prevention and Public Health Innovation - Sec. 4304 Epidemiology-Laboratory Capacity Grants – These grants are subject to the availability of appropriations. These grants are for State health departments as well as local health departments and tribal jurisdictions. Academic centers that assist State and eligible local and tribal health departments may also be eligible for funding under this section. The grants shall be awarded to assist public health agencies in improving surveillance for, and response to, infectious disease and other condition of public health importance.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section \$190,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2013.

Title V – Health Care Workforce – Subtitle B – Innovations in the Health Care Workforce - Sec. 5102 State health care workforce development grants – This program has been established for the purpose of enabling State partnerships to complete comprehensive planning and to carry out activities leading to coherent and comprehensive health care workforce development strategies at the State and local levels.

Planning Grants – Authorized to be appropriated to award planning grants under subsection (c) \$8,000,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary for each subsequent fiscal year.

Implementation Grants – Authorized to be appropriated to award implementation grants under subsection (d), \$150,000,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary for each subsequent fiscal year.

Title V – Health Care Workforce – Subtitle C – Increasing the Supply of the Health Care Workforce - Sec. 5206 Grants for State and local programs – Grants to award scholarships to eligible individuals to enroll in degree or professional training programs for the purpose of enabling mid-career professionals in the public health and allied health workforce to receive additional training in the field of public health or allied health.

There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section, \$60,000 for fiscal year 2010 and such sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal years 2011 through 2015.

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Title V – Health Care Workforce – Subtitle E –Supporting the Existing Health Care Workforce - Sec. 5405 – Sec 399W Primary Care Extension Program – Grants to Establish State Hubs and Local Primary Care Extension Agencies – Grants to States for the establishment of State- or multistate-level primary care Primary Care Extension Program State Hubs.

There are authorized to be appropriated \$120,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2011 and 2012, and such sums as may be necessary to carry out this section for each of fiscal years 2013 through 2014.

Title VI – Transparency and Program Integrity – Part III – Improving Staff Training - Subtitle H – Elder Justice Act - Subpart B – Elder Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation Forensic Centers - Part II – Programs to Promote Elder Justice - Sec. 2041 Enhancement of Long-Term Care – Grants for individuals to train for, seek, and maintain employment providing direct care in long-term care. Grants to long-term care facilities for the purpose of assisting such entities in offsetting the cost related to purchasing, leasing, developing, and implementing certified EHR technology designed to improve patient safety and reduce adverse events and health care complications resulting from medical errors. **Grants to Enhance the Provision of Adult Protective Services –** Grants to States for the purposes of enhancing adult protective services provided by States and local units of government.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section – (1) for fiscal year 2011, \$20,000,000; (2) for fiscal year 2012, \$17,500,000; and (3) for each of fiscal years 2013 and 2014, \$15,000,000.

Sec. 2043 Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program Grants and Training – Grants to improve the capacity of State long-term care ombudsman programs to respond to and resolve complaints about abuse and neglect. Grants will also be available to State Agencies that perform surveys of skilled nursing facilities.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this subsection - (A) for fiscal year 2011, \$5,000,000; (B) for fiscal year 2012, \$7,500,000; and (C) for each of fiscal years 2013 and 2014, \$10,000,000.

Title X – Strengthening Quality, Affordable Health Care for All Americans – Subtitle B – Provisions Relating to Title II – Part II – Support for Pregnant and Parenting Teens and Women - Sec. 10212 Establishment of Pregnancy Assistance Fund – Grants to States to assist pregnancy and parenting teens and women.

Title X – Strengthening Quality, Affordable Health Care for All Americans - Subtitle E – Provisions Relating to Title V - Sec. 10607 - Sec. 399V-4 State Demonstration Programs to Evaluate Alternatives to Current Medical Tort Litigation– Grants to States for the development, implementation, and evaluation of alternatives to current tort litigation for resolving disputes over injuries allegedly caused by health care providers or health care organizations.

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section, \$50,000,000 for the 5-fiscal year period beginning with fiscal year 2011.

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
