

# **Congress Finalizes \$1.5T FY22 Spending Package – No Additional COVID Funding for Providers**

March 9, 2022

The House plans to vote today on the \$1.5 trillion Omnibus spending package to fund the government through FY22. It also plans to vote on a short-term continuing resolution through March 15 in case the Senate needs more time to pass the spending package. The current deadline is midnight, Friday, March 11.

### **COVID-19 Supplemental – No Additional Funds for Providers**

The Covid supplemental **DOES NOT** include any additional funding for the Provider Relief Fund or any other direct funds for health care providers. The Administration's request of \$22.5 billion (down from the \$30 billion in initial discussions) was whittled down to \$15.6 billion for domestic preparedness, global response and humanitarian assistance. #### **Telehealth Waivers**

Certain waivers – those requiring statutory authority – were extended for 151 days after the end of the Public Health Emergency (PHE). These include removing the geographic restrictions and expanding the originating sites, expanding eligible practitioners, expanding telehealth services for FQHCs and RHCs and continuing the use of audio-only for telehealth. It also delays the inperson requirement for mental health services that was scheduled to take effect upon the expiration of the PHE. #### 340B

In a significant win, the bill includes language based on Sen. Thune's bill, S. 773, that would allow for DSH hospitals to maintain their 340B eligibility during the PHE regardless of a change to their DSH percentage. Click <a href="here">here</a> to review the 340B text beginning on page 1870.
